Winter Team Walk Saturday 1st February 2020

Having had to cancel the planned walk around Reigate Heath with a visit to the Windmill church in November, we're praying for better weather for the same walk in February.

Here's the up to date information about our WinterTeam walk,

We'll meet; weather permitting, at <u>9:45 sharp</u> at The Pheasant at Buckland on the A25 between Dorking and Reigate. (Directions are at the end of this email). PLEASE NOTE JOURNEY TIME CAN BE 40 MINUTES WITH TRAFFIC

From the Pheasant car park we'll walk a circular 3 mile path around Reigate Heath and visit the Reigate Heath Windmill church. We should arrive back at the car park around 12:00.

The walk has a couple of small rises that will be taken at a steady pace.

NOTE.

HAVING WALKED THE ROUTE TODAY THERE ARE SEVERAL VERY VERY MUDDY STRETCHES. YOU WILL NEED WELLIES OR BOOTS. IF YOU CHOOSE TO WALK IN OTHER FOOTWEAR YOU DO SO AT YOUR OWN RISK. IF YOU HAVE WALKING POLES OR STICKS IT MIGHT BE HELPFUL TO BRING THEM.

There are no places to purchase food and drink on the route so please bring your own if you fancy a coffee. There are no toilets on the route.

PLEASE BE SURE THAT YOU ARE FEELING WELL ENOUGH TO COMPLETE THE WALK.

If it is heavy rain on the day we won't be walking, but if showers are forecast the walk may well go ahead. Please call Dave on 07540702400 before 9 a.m. if you are unsure.

Sadly, and for the first time on our walks, we're not able to arrange a block booking for lunch at a local pub, café or restaurant. Having visited many, and tried their food, none are able to accommodate a large party for a lunch on that Saturday. Consequently what we propose is that you might like to try The Pheasant, where we park, as at 12:00 they might be able to seat tables of 4. Alternatively there are several places on the routes back to Surbiton, such as the Arkle Manor (1.5 miles back to wards Dorking), The Watermill on the right just before the Dorking main roundabout and The Stepping Stones at Westhumble, on the A24 just before the Box Hill roundabout.

Directions to the start – Journey time about 40 minutes

From the Ace of Spades roundabout, take the A243 towards Chessington.

Take the A243 Leatherhead bypass towards Dorking.

Continue along the A243, which becomes the A24, to Dorking.

Pass the bottom of Box Hill, then Dorking railway station, until you come to the roundabout with the large Silver cockerel in the middle, the junction of A24 and A25.

Take the first exit A25 to Reigate.

After 2.5 miles take the second exit on roundabout A25 to Reigate.

After just over 1 mile look for a pub; The Pheasant at Buckland on the right side of the road.

Turn in and park at the back of the car park.
