<u>Returning to Church</u> – We are trialling swapping our services around so our service times are now 9.30am (with children's provision) and the more traditional service at 10.45am. We will have children's groups in the 9.30am service, although they will still be operating in combined groups for the time being - Scramblers with Climbers and Explorers with Pathfinders.

We are planning a **Gift Day** for **Sunday 9 May**. The PCC agreed to invite members of the congregation to make a donation to some exciting projects in the church but also donating 10% of anything raised to local charities and a further 10% to Christian Aid Week which runs from 10 -16 May this year. A letter will be coming out to you in hard copy or by email or please find it on the website. Please be thinking and praying about your response.

<u>Christian Aid Week-</u> Along with 5 other local clergy Helen is going to be walking 4.5 miles each day of Christian Aid Week, carrying 2 buckets of water to share in a very small way with those who make such journeys for water every day.

Christian Aid highlights the plight of Rose who walks 8km each day to collect 4 jerry cans of water - and then carries them home. People like Rose are struggling to survive without a reliable source of water. From drought to flooding, climate chaos robs people of control over their lives. I often feel hungry, Rose says. Because of climate change, I worry a lot about food. I pray to God that the rainfall will become normal like it used to be. In recent years, the drought has been so bad that it's caused a hunger crisis. Crops wither and die. Rivers run dry. People struggle to survive. The coronavirus pandemic has only made this lack of water more critical for Rose. Without water for handwashing, it is a struggle to stay safe from the virus. Please support my fundraising and help to provide reliable water source, for people like Rose.
