Following the results of the survey, our <u>AwayWeekend</u> has been postponed – hopefully until Spring 2022. However, following the previously very successful AwayDay we are planning to hold another one of those on Saturday 16 October instead so please keep the date in your diary.

<u>Ascension Day –</u> there will be a THiS Team service at St Paul's at 10am which will then be available to watch on the Team YouTube Channel.

<u>Christian Aid Week-</u> Along with 5 other local clergy Helen is going to be walking 4.5 miles each day of Christian Aid Week (10 - 15 May), carrying 2 buckets of water to share in a very small way with those who make such journeys for water every day.

Christian Aid highlights the plight of Rose who walks 8km each day to collect 4 jerry cans of water and then carries them home. People like Rose are struggling to survive without a reliable source of water. From drought to flooding, climate chaos robs people of control over their lives. I often feel hungry, Rose says. Because of climate change, I worry a lot about food. I pray to God that the rainfall will become normal like it used to be. In recent years, the drought has been so bad that it's caused a hunger crisis. Crops wither and die. Rivers run dry. People struggle to survive. The coronavirus pandemic has only made this lack of water more critical for Rose. Without water for handwashing, it is a struggle to stay safe from the virus. Please support my fundraising and help to provide reliable water source, for people like Rose.
