Ash Wednesday Services (5th March) will be at 12 noon and 7pm.

Lent - Lent is a good way off but we need you to be thinking about whether you could help out with a Lent Study group. We will be using Stephen Cottrell's book, Christ in the Wilderness, which looks at a painting by the English artist Stanley Spencer each week. We will need leaders/coordinators and hosts, although you could meet in one of the rooms at Church if not enough people feel able to invite people to their homes. The book is very thin and is discussion based. We encourage all existing housegroups to use it as well so that we can reference it in Worship. If you want to join a group we will sort out days and times later on. The new groups are intended for Lent, not for ever, so if you lead you are making, at most, a six session commitment. Let Caroline or a member of the Discipleship and Ministry team know if you can do this - you have plenty of time to pray about it! There will be at least one additional group meeting during Lent led by the Vicar. It is likely to be mid-morning on Wednesday although I am happy to do an evening group in-person or on zoom as well. Please let me know what you would like. This will begin the week after Ash Wednesday and continue until Holy Week.

<u>Further Services</u> -There will be a joint Team Service on Palm Sunday (13th April) at 4pm at St. Matthews and another at 4pm on Pentecost Sunday (8th June) at St. Georges. More will be set as we go through the year. If you would like to be involved in planning please let the Vicar know.

The Bereavement Journey begins on 22nd April for seven Tuesday afternoons 2-4.30pm. It is suitable for those of any faith or no faith and is for anyone bereaved in any way and at any time. To benefit from the course participants should be able to attend all of the first six sessions. KCAH has opened the Winter Night Shelter 2025.

"We need volunteers to get involved to ensure we can provide the safe space for those that need it — you can sign up here. We are also recruiting additional paid staff, if you or someone you know would like to apply please see our website for more details. Running for 3 months, we will offer a place of sanctuary, safety and warmth for up to 30 people, twice as many as last year and a direct response to the demand. To enable this we have been fortunate to have support from the Local Authority and a local landlord of a currently disused space in the centre of Kingston. The night shelter needs as many volunteers as it can get to cover the evening, night owl and early riser shifts at its two locations. The shifts in Thames Street are 19.00-23.30pm, 23.30-05.30, and 05.30-07.30. There's a staff member there on duty at all times. Other volunteers deliver a cooked meal for 15 people around 20.00. If you are able to volunteer your time even for a couple of shifts or to provide one evening meal for all guests, please register as a volunteer. Thank you for supporting KCAH and thank you for hearing this message and ensuring many people in need will not be adversely impacted this winter". Georgie
